
CONFLICT

The last few Sundays we have been reflecting on conflict. Jesus experienced conflict in the wilderness with the tempter. Jesus faced conflict with both religious leaders and political influencers. We all experience conflict.





There was always a messianic tension in Jewish life. An intense expectation of a Savior. This is what brings conflict to the Palm Sunday story - a messianic twist. Israel was a nation with a couple of characteristics: [1] they had an underdog complex & [2] they had a promise.

For a large part of their history, the people of Israel were under the oppression of various superpowers. From Egypt to Rome, being oppressed and overruled by the enemy was a big part of the Israelite identity. But, Israel was also a nation with a Book filled with promises that a Messiah would save and send its enemies into flight. Texts like Isaiah 49 were formative, "This is what the Lord says: ...in the day of salvation I will help you... I will restore the land and reassign its desolate inheritances... I will say to the captives, 'Come out! 'And to those in darkness, 'Be free!'"

For the most part, words such as these were viewed through the lens of nationalism. Therefore, the people were looking for a political, military type of savior. And so, embedded in their national identity was the anticipation of this type of deliverer / King, and at this point in time, Jesus seemed to be the perfect candidate. Jesus had a three-year resume of healing and teaching, and doing it all with a convincing essence of Divine authority & power. And Lazarus was the lynchpin. If you are looking for a Messiah and you are going through the resumes, and there is a candidate on the list who can raise the dead—he's your man!

Jesus was their man. Or so it appeared. Palms were waved in the air as Jesus entered Jerusalem. Jesus was given a conquerors welcome into the city. Palm waving was a victory celebration. The war is over, and we won!

Yes, may the conflict begin. The crowds were welcoming a victor, but little did they know it was the wrong war. Jesus came to wage a much greater struggle, the cause and source of all the others, the struggle "not against flesh and blood, but against the rulers, against the authorities, against the powers of this dark world and against the spiritual forces of evil in the heavenly realms" (Ephesians 6:12).

This is the struggle that Jesus would win, but it was a struggle that first required the shedding of blood. "Without the shedding of blood there is no forgiveness of sins" (Hebrews 9:22). It would be the victory in this struggle through which Jesus would claim the title Savior, Lord, King and Victor. His resurrection would secure this, but the crowds couldn't wait. Their eyes went elsewhere. Their expectations and their impatience would get the best of them and in just a few days they would cry, "Crucify him!"

Yes, it's Palm Sunday. May the conflict begin.
